Shriners for Children Medical Center, Pasadena Happenings for July 2019

While pondering the many options that could be of interest to the Shrine Nobility, it occurred to the writer that many Nobles may not know the structure of the Board of Governors.

Members of the Board of Governors' come from the seven (7) Shrine Centers that support the Medical Center. Nomination for service starts at the individual Shrine Centers and should not be a reward for previous Shrine service but should be based on the talent required by the Board at the time a vacancy is being filled. No Shrine Center is guaranteed a fixed number of positions.

Imperial Bylaws, Article 5, Para. 105.1, Membership, describes the requirements for selection of the various class of Board Members, Regular, Emeritus, At Large and Associate. Only Regular Members have voting rights. In additions to the Shriner Board Members, Board Meetings are attended by the Medical Center Chief of Staff Dr. Robert Cho, Administrator Christopher Dougherty, Director of Patient Care Services Janet Amerkhanian, Tijuana Admistrator Patricia Siqueiros and Executive Assistant Celia Smith. Plus other occasional Medical or Administrative Staff.

The Chairman may, on occasion, call for Executive Session, and all, save Regular Members, may be asked to leave the Board room. Hopefully, this very brief description of the selection, structure and function of the Board, will excite your interest to the point of reading the Imperial Bylaws sections dealing with the Boards.

At the meeting in July, it was announced that the Medical Center has a new Board of Trustees Liaison,

Imperial Sir David Worel, the newly elected Imperial Outer Guard from Alaska Shrine, Anchorage.

Welcome Imperial Sir David, we look forward to working with you.

The Tijuana Clinic in July had over 900 patient visits and 129 procedures. The joint use agreement with Hospital Angeles is near completion and it is expected that the Clinic will move into its new, large facilities the 2nd week of December. With this move the Clinic expects a substantial financial improvement which will allow for Shrine Care for more Kids.

Board of Trustees member helps Jamaican child receive life-changing care

Friday, January 18, 2019

Shriners Hospitals for Children — St. Louis Board of Governors member Joe Shivley teamed up with Poplar Bluff, Missouri pediatrician Debra Robertson, M.D., to help bring baby Isabel from Jamaica to St. Louis for life-changing brachial plexus palsy surgery.

When mom Geneva was in labor last January, Isabel "Izzy" became stuck in the birth canal for over six minutes, which caused tearing of the nerves in her arm. Though some babies with minor cases recover naturally, many require a nerve repair surgery, ideally before age 1. The Bennett family lives in South Central Jamaica in the town of May Pen, which is about two hours from the capitol of Kingston and the nearest children's hospital.

The Bennetts knew something was wrong with Izzy's shoulder when she was born. When Dr. Robertson came to Jamaica on a medical mission trip last July, she recognized Izzy's condition and suggested the Bennetts take Izzy to Bustamante Children's Hospital in Kingston. She also recommended reaching out to the Shriners, and connected them with Moolah Shriner Joe Shivley to help get Izzy an appointment. "This is why we do what we do as Shriners," Shivley said. "This hospital works miracles."

Despite the fact that Mr. Shivley lives in Poplar Bluff and the Bennett family lives in

Jamaica, Izzy received a surgery appointment date and an emergency medical visa. The family made its way to St. Louis and she underwent surgery on January 15. The mission group Mission Four 18 and their leaders Len and Aimee Scott helped tremendously, as Geneva and dad Terrence serve as local representatives for them in Jamaica.

Izzy will stay in the United States for three to four weeks, depending on her recovery time. She will have a second surgery later this year. Once she recovers, she will have much more range of motion and will be able to start walking and keeping up with other kids her age, all due to the help of our local board member!

LAUS DEO

One detail that is seldom mentioned is that in Washington, D.C. there can never be a building of greater height than the Washington Monument. With all the uproar about removing the Ten Commandments, etc., this is worth a moment or two of your time. I was not aware of this amazing historical information.

On the aluminum cap, atop the Washington Monument in Washington, D.C., are displayed two words: Laus Deo. No one can see these words. In fact, most visitors to the monument are totally unaware they are even there and for that matter, probably couldn't care less.

Once you know Laus Deo's history, you will want to share this with everyone you know. These words have been there for many years; they are 555 feet, 5.125 inches high, perched atop the monument, fang skyward to the Father of our nation, overlooking the 69 square miles which comprise the District of Columbia, capital of the United States of America. Laus Deo! Two seemingly insignificant, unnoticed words.

Out of sight and, one might think, out of mind, but very meaningfully placed at the highest point over what is the most powerful city in the most successful nation in the world. So, what do those two words, in Latin, composed of just four syllables and only seven letters, possibly mean? Very simply, they say 'Praise be to God!'

Though construction of this giant obelisk began in1848, when James Polk was President of the United States, it was not until 1888 that the monument was inaugurated and opened to the public.

It took twenty-five years to finally cap the memorial with a tribute to the Father of our nation, Laus Deo, 'Praise be to God!'

From atop this magnificent granite and marble structure, visitors may take in the beautiful panoramic view of the city with its division into four major segments. From that vantage point, one can also easily see the original plan of the designer, Pierre Charles L'Enfant a perfect cross imposed upon the landscape, with the White House to the north, The Jefferson Memorial is to the south, the Capitol to the east and the Lincoln Memorial to the west.

A cross you ask? Why a cross? What about separation of church and state? Yes, a cross; separation of church and state was NOT, is NOT, in the Constitution.

The phrase "separation between church & state" is generally traced to a January 1, 1802, letter by Thomas Jefferson, addressed to the Danbury Baptist Association in Connecticut, and published in a Massachusetts newspaper.

How interesting and, no doubt, intended to carry a profound meaning for those who bother to notice.

When the cornerstone of the Washington Monument was laid on July 4th, 1848 deposited within it were many items including the Holy Bible presented by the Bible Society. Praise be to God! Such was the discipline, the moral direction, and the spiritual mood given by the founder and first President of our unique democracy 'One Nation Under God.'

Just a brief update from Shriners For Children Medical Center – Pasadena. We are very pleased to announce that we have entered an agreement with the Children's Hospital of Los Angeles (CHLA). The current agreement gives our Shriners physicians the capability to perform complex surgical cases at CHLA and admit inpatients there. There is wonderful for our patients and families for it gives them access to a premier Children's Hospital environment right here in LA County. Just recently CHLA was rated as a top 5 Children's Hospital in the United States by US News and World reports and we are delighted to partner with them Not only should this inpatient partnership with CHLA give our patients access to the highest quality pediatric hospital in the area and a wonderful child friendly environment, we believe this will also save Shriners a good bit of expenses. Huntington Hospital, our inpatient partner up until now, did not have contracts with all of the payors that we do. This meant that in order to get inpatient services provided at Huntington Hospital, Shriners had to pay them on a per case basis. In contrast, CHLA has contracts with all of the payors we need them to. This will mean that our patients will get their inpatients services funded by their own insurance and not by Shriners for the most part. This should result in substantial savings and an opportunity to further reduce our draw on the endowment. All of this is just the first step in what will hopefully be an even larger partnership between Shriners For Children Medical Center For Children Pasadena and CHLA. As we speak we are working on a Memorandum of Understanding between the two institutions that would create the springboard for exploring other exciting ways that we could partner together to provide incredible care to children. Orthotic and Prosthetic Program Improves Patient Function

Meet Zoe, a second grader who loves school, her dolls, dancing, playing basketball and kicking the soccer ball around. Zoe was born with amniotic band syndrome. In Zoe's case, this meant her right forearm and all of her toes were missing, and the fingers on her left hand were shorter.

RESEARCHING THE CONDITION

Zoe's parents learned of her condition while she was still in utero. During her 24-week pregnancy checkup and ultrasound, the physician told her mom that her daughter would be born without a right forearm. While it was a very stressful revelation for the family, it also gave them time to prepare and research.

The absence of a right forearm would mean that Zoe would need a prosthetic arm above the elbow. Zoe's mom spoke with her pediatrician. Amy Webb, M.D., and other local physicians about this, and they recommended Shriners for Children Medical Center in Pasadena (known at the time as Shriners Hospitals for Children® - Los Angeles). She learned about the Child Amputee Prosthetics Project, or CAPP, now known as Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services (POPS). She was very impressed with the staff and loved how they connected with the patients. "We could truly see how the staff really loved what they did for these children." she said.

PROSTHETICS AND CARE

Once Zoe was born, her parents knew she would be going to Shriners for Children Medical Center in Pasadena for care and therapy. When Zoe was old enough to walk, she received her first prosthetic arm.

Zoe worked with an occupational therapist at Shriners for Children Medical Center in Pasadena and quickly learned how to use her prosthesis. Zoe's mom said, "It was amazing to watch her development over the years."

Zoe's family found the help they needed with orthopaedic subspecialty care offered through the POPS program at Shriners for Children Medical Center in Pasadena. Zoe's prosthesis helps her play basketball, have fun with her dolls and much more. Many families who receive care at Shriners for Children Medical Center in Pasadena have said it is comforting to know there is a pediatric health care facility with a knowledgeable medical staff to help so many overcome obstacles, such as those Zoe's family faced.




