There has been some virtual seminars over the last couple months on membership growth and retention. According to Shiners International the average age of Shriners are mid 60's and the age goes up every year due to the fact that younger members are not being created. As lodges are now in full swing coming out of this pandemic we should be making ourselves present and informing newly raised masons about our organization and what we stand for.

But what do we do with these new members? Do we just create them and cut them loose? We need to make sure we are their mentoring them and assist in guiding them to accommodate their needs. We are restarting a program where we take the newly created members introduce them to the divan and club leaders so we can get them plugged in and be active in the shrine. Handing them a directory and a fez simply doesn't work. I remember when I was created, every shrine club or unit president was present and gave a synopsis of what their club is all about.

I believe we can overcome any challenge that presents itself to us. We are currently about 590 members. A mentor once told me early in my masonic career, "If everyone can replace themselves, you will double your membership." We cover a vast area of southern California with many blue lodges within this area. We could easily replace ourselves and get to over 1000 members. With these new members comes new club members and new clubs as well as they may come in with new ideas and help our shrine thrive and grow even more. So please go out find new members and while you are out there, don't forget about our long lost members and bring them back as well.

ORIENTAL GUIDE



Greetings and Salutations to everyone!

Hopefully you all have been having a fantastic year so far. One of the things I would like to discuss in my article for this newsletter is my excursion to Oriental Guide School in Tampa. The majority of this article is from my Oriental Guide School Report that was given at the April 2022 Stated Meeting, and the formal extended copy given to the Recorder

for the records. If anyone would like to receive a copy of my extended report, don't hesitate to ask me and I will happily send you a copy of it.

There were over 100 Oriental Guides in attendance, and to my personal happiness, over 30 of these attendees were, like myself, Millennials.

Oriental Guide School was overall incredibly productive, as well as informative. The main focus that Imperial wants our attention on is that of Membership. It is recognized that the Covid-19 Pandemic has had a negative impact on Membership across all of society. Now that society has begun to slowly reopen, Membership gains and Retention must be one of our largest priorities.

With an average age across Shriners International being between late 60's and early 70's, Imperial strongly encouraged focusing on the Younger Generations of Masons and Shriners. In particular, they want to focus on the Millennials. For those who do not have a clear understanding of what defines being a Millennial, they are those who are born between 1981 through 1996. There are many Sociological Studies about the different generations, but when it comes to Millennials, these years seem to be the consensus about the years that make up that generation.

Before anyone starts to grumble about this need to focus on the younger generations, let me give you some numbers from a slide that was shown to us at OG School.

- 1978: 941,799 Members
- 2022: 190, 239 Members

As you can see, as a fraternity, Shriners peaked at membership numbers in 1978 with the above listed number of Active Members. If the difference between the numbers shocks you, that is an almost 80% drop in members. The most common reason for the drop of course is the Black Camel. Other reasons range from Suspension for Dues, Demits, Members not getting what they hoped to receive from joining the Shrine, and what shocked me most of all: Members not feeling welcome in their own Temples due to how the Nobility act towards them and their families. On this last point, honestly, we all can do better.

Our beloved Shrine and Fraternity must adapt to the changing times if we wish to remain relevant to anyone wishing to join, and most important of all, keep coming back. One way we can do this, at least amongst the younger members, is to focus on FAMILIES. The difference between what our Member households were like 30, 40, 50 plus years ago vs. now must be taken into account for Membership Growth and Retention:

• One Income Families common

Today's families have multiple incomes, sometimes both spouses work more than 1 job each to make ends meet.

- Women took care of the family
 - This is not so much the case today, as there are multiple reasons for this.
- Less children were in daycares

This is now a common occurrence for young children to be in daycare due to both parents having to work.

• How much free time was there for families?

Gone are the days when a sole breadwinner (mainly men) would come home at the end of an 8-10 or even 12 hour work day and say to their spouse: "Honey, I've had a long day at work. I'm going to the Shrine Temple to unwind with the guys. Be home later."

This above attitude would not fly today in society and must be considered no longer relevant for our future and current younger members and their families.

• What have cellphones done with our free time?

Now that I have gotten the "Doom and Gloom" stuff out of the way, and still hopefully have your attention, I will leave you with 2 questions that were asked of us at Imperial that made an impact on me, and hopefully will with you too:

- 1. Are the actions we are taking today increasing membership?
- 2. If not, how should we be pursuing the task?

Thank you for taking the time to read my article. Remember that you can make a difference with Membership, even by bringing in just 1 new Shriner.

Greetings Nobles all, Origins of May Day

Did you know that May Day has its roots in astronomy? Traditionally, it was the halfway point between the spring equinox and the summer solstice! In ancient times, this was

one of the Celtic cross-quarter days, which mark the midway points between the (four) solstices and equinoxes of the year.

As with many early holidays, May Day was rooted in agriculture. Springtime festivities filled with song and dance celebrated the sown fields starting to sprout. Cattle were driven to pasture, special bonfires were lit, and doors of houses as well as livestock were decorated with yellow May flowers. In the Middle Ages, the Gaelic people celebrated the festival of Beltane. Beltane means "Day of Fire." People created large bonfires and danced at night to celebrate.

May Day has a long history and tradition in England, some of which eventually came to America. Children would dance around the Maypole holding onto colorful ribbons. People would "bring in the May" by gathering wildflowers and green branches, weaving of floral hoops and hair garlands, and crowning a May king and queen. Such rites originally may have been intended to ensure fertility for crops and, by extension, for livestock and humans, but in most cases this significance was gradually lost, so that the practices survived largely as popular festivities.
